

Recyclable Materials	Examples
<b>PLASTIC</b> <b>RECYCLE GRADES 1 - 7</b> <b>EXCLUDES POLYSTYRENE</b>	<i>Drink bottles</i> <i>Food containers</i> <i>Cleaning product containers</i> <i>Plastic trays</i> <i>Empty plastic bags</i>
<b>TINS AND CANS</b>	<i>Aluminium drinking cans</i> <i>Food tins</i> <i>Pet food tins</i>
<b>GLASS</b>	<i>Glass bottles and jars</i>
<b>PAPER AND CARDBOARD</b>	<i>Newspapers and magazines</i> <i>Egg cartons</i> <i>Office paper and envelopes</i> <i>Junk mail</i> <i>Cereal boxes</i> <i>Toilet paper rolls</i> <i>Cardboard boxes, including pizza boxes (but remove pizza scraps!)</i> <i>Brown corrugated cardboard</i>

## Remember to:

Remove lids, wash and squash your plastic and tins / cans

Place all recycling materials loosely in thier bins - don't tie up paper and cardboard.

Don't Put These in Your Recycling	Examples
<b>AEROSOLS</b>	<i>Fly spray</i> <i>Spray deodorant</i> <i>Cream cans</i>
<b>SPECIFIC TYPES OF PLASTIC AND METALLIC WRAP AND PACKAGING</b>	<i>Polystyrene</i> <i>Bubble wrap</i> <i>Glad wrap</i> <i>Tin foil</i> <i>Meat trays (polystyrene)</i>
<b>WAX-COATED OR LINED CARTONS</b>	<i>Milk and juice cartons</i>
<b>GENERAL WASTE</b>	<i>Food and liquid</i> <i>Cloth or clothing</i> <i>Bottle and jar lids</i>
<b>SPECIFIC TYPES OF GLASS</b>	<i>Broken glass</i> <i>Ceramics</i> <i>Drinking glasses and cups</i> <i>Glass bricks</i> <i>Light bulbs and fluorescent tubes</i> <i>Medical and lab glass containers</i> <i>Mirrors</i> <i>Pyrex</i> <i>TV tubes and computer screens</i> <i>Vases and ornamental glass</i> <i>Window glass</i>
